



On November 14, 2018, Denver City Council approved Mayor Hancock’s 2019 Budget. Here is summary of funding for key areas related to creating people friendly streets, where walking, biking, and transit are safe and convenient options for all Denverites.

Building the Sidewalk and Bicycle Networks - \$10.1 M (\$3.7 M in 2018)	
New Sidewalk Construction	\$3 M (\$1.5 M in 2018)
Denver Moves Bicycles Implementation	\$7.1 M (\$2.2 M in 2018)
Vision Zero - \$4.3 M (\$2.7 M in 2018)	
Vision Zero (General)	\$ 1.6 M (\$1M in 2018)
Safe Routes to School	\$ 1.3 M (\$500 K in 2018)
Neighborhood Transportation Management	\$ 688 K (\$423 K in 2018)
Pedestrian crossings	\$ 800 K (\$750 K in 2018)
Federal Boulevard (Denver’s Most Deadly Street) - \$1.25 M	
Long-term redesign of Colfax/Federal cloverleaf interchange	\$500 K
Transit alternatives analysis	\$750 K
Complete Streets - \$500 K	
Complete Streets Design Guidelines	\$500 K
